## **Pastor's Corner**

We live in a time, age, and place where it is almost fatal to show our vulnerability. Social media has something to do with that, but it is our general tendency to paint ourselves better than who we really are. If people just look at my Facebook, they would think that I have a perfect life with a handsome husband, talented girls, almost a thousand friends, endless resources and bliss from them all. The truth is that I am not perfect and I lead an imperfect life; I am a sinner in need of grace,

mercy, and forgiveness. I am a high-maintenance and needy person! I need Jesus every moment!

Brene Brown is one of my favorite authors; she is a research professor at the University of Houston who spent the past two decades studying courage, vulnerability, shame, and empathy. She is the author of five #1 New York Times bestsellers: The Gifts of Imperfection, Daring Greatly, Rising Strong, Braving the Wilderness, and Dare to Lead. These are Brene Brown's words defining 'vulnerability': "Vulnerability...when I ask people what vulnerability is, the answers were things like sitting with my wife who has a stage 2 breast cancer and trying to make plans for our children, my first date after my divorce, saying I love you first, asking for a raise, sending my child to school being enthusiastic and supportive of him and knowing how excited he is about orchestra tryouts and how much he wants to make first chair and encouraging him and supporting him and knowing that's not going to happen, etc."

Vulnerability is courage. It's about the willingness to show up and be seen in our lives as who we are. In those moments when we show up, raise our heads, and stand tall, the most powerful meaning-making, meaningful moments of our lives happen. And I call them, "defining moments of our lives." In this jolly season, I want you to meditate on the word, "vulnerability" and consider the cornerstone of our faith, Jesus Christ, our gentle savior and Messiah, who came to us as a baby totally dependent on his parents, taken to Egypt as a refugee at the mercy of Egyptians, growing up as a carpenter's son, mocked and beaten, and then hung up on a cross like a criminal to die. Jesus did not hide; he was not ashamed of vulnerability. He embodied it for our sake so that we may live an authentic life free of hot air or inhibitions...

A merry Christmas! Christ came; he came for me and you- and for us all! May you have a defining moment of your life this Christmas!

- Piano Restoration Pledges (30 Pledges) \$14,000.00


