

December Lunches of Love Story: A Weeklong Offering of Service

On Sunday, December 17, Serve Sunday began in the Family Life Center with songs of praise, a message of hope and some hands-on service. Hundreds of donated mugs were transformed into gifts as they were filled with hot chocolate mix, hand crafted chocolate covered spoons and candy canes. Across the room hundreds of large bags were filled with toiletry items for approximately 2,000 people. Upstairs, volunteers sorted and packed age-appropriate toys into dozens of large boxes to fill the back of a 26-foot truck transforming it into a mobile Christmas Shoppe. Our Serve Sunday Worship Service ended with the loading of gifts and supplies into 2 large U-Haul trucks.

The worship service was over but for dozens of volunteers, their 6-hour shift was just beginning! Over the next 2 days, hundreds of families in 4 different neighborhoods were served. Thankfully we received a large donation mid-week from the Norcross Community Co-op. Their donation of 2 truckloads of gifts and toys helped to meet the need for the rest of the week. 4 different pick-up times were organized and staffed by volunteer "elves" at the church. Individual deliveries were completed on 3 separate days. On Sunday morning, December 24 th , one week after "Serve Sunday", the final gifts were picked up. - Cheryl Mitchell

December Lunches of Love Story: One Family's Journey

As we were finishing up at one of the neighborhoods, we met a young mom who was getting her mail. She asked why there was a crowd. As I started to explain who we are and why we were there, she told me she was trying to forget about Christmas this year. She explained that she is a single mom who recently moved to the area. She hasn't made any friends and she recently experienced the death of a child. She is alone, struggling financially and this Christmas is just so hard. She explained that she told her young daughter that she just couldn't afford any gifts this year and that there would not be any signs of Christmas at their house. As we spoke, I listened to the grief overflowing with each word. I shared with her my experience with loss and grief at Christmastime when I was about her age, acknowledging how it all just seems unbearably harder to deal with at this time of year. She opened up a bit more and then, she allowed the conversation to shift.

Soon we were talking about the hope and peace we can find in Christ, even in these most difficult situations. Especially, in these most difficult situations! We were both crying by the time she asked if she could hug me. With her permission we filled a bag with toys for her 6-year-old daughter including a brand new beautiful princess doll that looked just like her description of her daughter. She saw a pink hat that she loved for her daughter and we found matching gloves. We quickly wrapped up a simple "Mom Gift" and handed it to her with another hug. In a matter of minutes volunteers were helping to carry bags of toiletries, food, and other supplies up the steps to her doorway. By the time the volunteers returned we were packed up and ready to head to the next neighborhood full of more families waiting patiently for us to arrive and share the love of Christ. -Cheryl Mitchell

Lunches of Love - Backpack Buddies

1 in 6 children in Georgia are hungry. We see the effects of food insecurity every time we make a delivery to our Lunches of Love Neighborhoods. When school starts, things shift. School aged kids who are living in poverty get 2 meals a day at school. But on the weekends... food is often scarce again.



Backpack Buddies of Metro Atlanta has been partnering with Lunches of Love at Mountain Park United Methodist Church to fill the weekend hunger gap. As a community partner with Backpack Buddies, our part is to be the liaison to the schools. We pick up food each Wednesday morning from the Backpack Buddies warehouse, assemble the food into individual bags each Thursday evening from 6:30 – 8:00pm and drop it off with the school counselor at a local Elementary School each Friday morning at 10am.

Since September we have distributed over 20,000 servings of food to children in Stone Mountain who do not have enough food at home. We have sign ups so that individuals and groups of all ages can plan to come and serve on Thursday evenings to assemble the food bags. We are also looking for drivers to drive to Dunwoody to pick up the bulk food items on Wednesday mornings, as well as drivers to deliver the food to the schools on Friday mornings.
